

Free UK Genealogy: FreeCEN2

<u>FreeCEN</u> is a free-to-search online database of the 19th century UK censuses. Transcribed entirely by volunteers, there are over **32 million records** available for people to search.

The new 'FreeCEN2' website, launched in August 2017, with all the records that the current website holds, but with a fresh new look and feel in-line with Free UK Genealogy and FreeREG. We believe that family history records should be **free** to access for **everyone**. The new site offers more features, and makes it easier to find what you're looking for.

Free UK Genealogy is a non-profit organisation that provides free, online access to family history records. We work with a team of dedicated volunteers to create high quality transcriptions of public records from governmental sources, parish churches, and other trusted institutions. We believe that Open Data and Open Source are key to making and keeping public records accessible to all.

Our volunteers have made available:

- 33,000,000 births, marriages and deaths in FreeBMD
- 38,000,000 records from parish registers in FreeREG
- 32,000,000 individuals from census data, from 1841 to 1891 in FreeCEN

We make the databases we create freely available for people to search in order to support their family history research. Unlike many sites, which are 'pay-to-view' after an initial search is carried out, our databases are completely free to search and view.
